If your child reads alone, please ask them questions about the characters, the plot, what they found similar or different about a book.

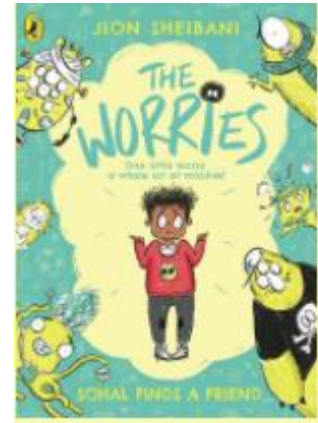
Some new titles this month

There are so many new books out every month. Here are a few recommendations that you might like to try.

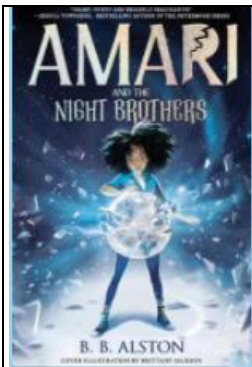


The Worrying Worries was out on the 7th January. It is written by Rachel Rooney. It is for ages 3+ and helps children deal with day to day anxieties.
